

Background:

How many years have you been part of GCI? 31 Years / How do you serve in GCI? Because of that, I decided to turn my back on that denomination, and a career in ministry. It was at that time that I joined GCI (formerly WCG). I remained a lay member for 15 years, at which point I was asked to become an elder in GCI. It was at a time GCI was going through major changes, and I was excited about the changes, and went into ministry. Since then I have served as a lead pastor of a local church, a regional pastor for one of the South African regions, and now a National Ministry Leader and regional Director for Southern Africa. Over the years I have enjoyed serving alongside many brothers and sisters. I enjoy teaching God's word to young and old alike. / Who has invested in you to support you in your ministry? When I came into GCI, the first member I met other than the pastor was Caleb Makhela. He became my father in the faith, and we have remained close since then until now. He has been somebody I always looked up to, whose example I have always tried to emulate.
