





### PASTOR




A pastor creates an environment of recruiting by modeling a pattern of recognizing and inviting others into the ministries of the church.



In empowering leaders, a pastor must create ministry spaces for new leaders. Don't recruit and develop without making room for the apprentice to lead.



The pastor must differentiate between ministry workers and leaders. She or he must focus on developing ministry leaders.




The pastor must understand that leaders are mainly volunteers and ministry can become difficult and the pastor needs to be attentive and encouraging.

### Looks like:

- Worship and Integration that are communicating, coordinating, holding planning meetings, and working well together.
- How are we using the RCL?
- How do our special worship events connect to neighborhood engagement?

### Contextualize:

- Are there clear roles and expectations for team members?
- Do the giftings and skills of your leaders match their roles?
- Can they consistently maintain the week-to-week flow?

### Looks like:

 Intentionally welcoming, well-coordinated ministries with clear next steps to discipleship: Greeters, Ushers, Parking Attendants, Children's Ministry, New Member classes. Spaces for fellowship and developing new relationship.

### Contextualize: • Are guests able to meaningfully follow the service without confusion?

- Does the content of our service spark conversations?
- Do we make physical accomodations? (Mother's room, wheelchair access, etc.)

Reflect

### Looks like:


• A service that celebrates the nature and presence of our triune God and is interactive with congregational response.

For instance: • Communion, baptism, and praise, confession, dedication, responsive reading, giving, scripture reading.

### Contextualize:

- Do guests feel welcome?
- Would a guest be able to participate in our service?
- Is our preaching scripture-based and applicable to the lives of our congregation?

Involving God's words to us and our words to God. Do we provide space for fellowship? Is the centrality of Jesus proclaimed and experienced throughout our worship gatherings? Is our integration ministry equipped and engaged?

### For instance:

- Prayer walks.
- Visiting Farmers markets, YMCA, etc.

### Looks like:

- Participating in community programs, and groups (Book Club, coaching, etc.)

### Contextualize:

- How can I add strategic routine to my daily rhythms?
- Having an orientation of focusing on others.
- Beyond individual efforts, how do we collectively engage with our neighbors and deepen those relationships?

Reflect

### Looks like:

Serving and loving the community with a purpose and intentional connection back to the life of the church.

### For instance:

• A Back to School Fair followed by a Blessing of the Children.


• Celebrating a recent neighborhood camp.

### Contextualize:

- What skills or abilities does my neighborhood engagement team have?
- Does our annual calendar have events that are inviting to neighbors, guests, and friends?
- Do our church events reflect our values and advance our shared vision?

Healthy Church involves a corporate desire to share Christ's love with all our neighbors.

Are we following up after initially reaching out? Are our neighborhood events connecting back to the life of the church? Are we creating a sustainable rhythm of neighborhood events?

Christian discipleship is the disciplined habit of thinking and acting in Christ. Discipleship is growing closer to Christ and more like Christ, and deeper into Christian community with other believers.

### Looks like:

- One-on-one mentoring (not limited only to the Faith Avenue).
- Retreats/Camps
- Church
  Picnics/BBQ
- Game NIghts
- Other ministries specific your congregation's needs.

### Contextualize: • Corporately do we spend time with my

- we spend time with my church family? (BBQ, Game Night, etc.)
- Are all age groups being appropriately served?
- Do I have a pathway to engage and disciple new believers?

### Looks like:

- A space for relationship building and spiritual growth.
- Smaller gatherings where bonding can occur and life on life discipleship happens.
- Contextualize: • What types of groups do my congregation and target community need?
- Are we digging deep into the written and living Word of God?
- Are facilitators and hosts being developed?
