Our mission, to share the love of Christ, remains the same, but our methods must evolve. God the Father sent his Son Jesus to accomplish that mission, and Jesus discipled others, who in turn discipled others. We are part of a long line of those who are called to participate in the relational ministry of our Triune God.

This is who we are. Jesus sends the Holy Spirit to call, form, and equip the church to share in his ongoing ministry, which is fulfilling the Father's mission to the world. The church exists because of, and for, God's mission.

True unity can be found only as we draw closer to Christ, preach his gospel, and live as he would. The goal is to promote him, not ourselves. In each of the shifts we present, making much of Jesus and space for seekers and guests are at the heart of our calling.



**1. DIGITAL & IN-PERSON CONNECTIONS** 

More and more, we are seeing the first step of engagement with a congregation to be through an online option, whether that be a visit to the website, checking out social media pages, or attending an online service. Digital options do not replace in-person connections, so we need next steps in place to invite those who have made digital connections into the life of the church.

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## 2. PASSIONATE PREACHING & SOUND TEACHING



A preacher is empowered by the Spirit and sparks a transformation that changes our perspective. A teacher is focused on information and outlines truths about who God is. A good pastor is both a passionate preacher and sound teacher. Information is shared that facilitates an experience with God.

» Next step: In addition to your sermon prep, review your sermon notes with the lens of, "Who is Jesus?" How is God's heart and character being revealed through your preaching?



## **3. PRESENCE & PRESENTATION**



Our incarnational God longs to be present with his people, and we innately long for God's presence. Intentionally plan an inspirational worship service where moments of silence, prayer, and corporate reading of Scripture create the space for people to experience God's presence in deep and communal ways.

» Next step: Develop a posture of participating with God, not performing for God, on your Hope Avenue Team.
