You don't ask the mechanic to help you fix your car-you turn it completely over to the mechanic.

What does hope look like for you in your life right now? My hope looks like my favorite scripture: 2 Peter 3:9 "The Lord is not slow about his promise, as some think of slowness, but is patient with you, not wanting any to perish, but all to come to repentance."
