

FINDING A NEW FACILITY

Finding a new church facility can be both exciting and intimidating. Here are some best practices to help you with your search.

1. KNOW YOUR NEIGHBORHOOD:

Take the time to exegete your neighborhood.

- » Discern what God is doing.
- » Learn about the characteristics of your neighborhood and your neighbors.
- » Learn the rhythms of your neighbors.
- » Discover the assets and needs of your community.
- » Identify your focus audience.
- » Have a clear mission and vision for how your congregation will engage with your focus neighborhood.

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2. KNOW YOUR NEEDS AND BUDGET:

Create a list of requirements and develop a budget.

- » Work with your leadership team to consider your ministry needs. What kinds of gatherings will you host in this space?
 - Minimum requirements: a room for a worship gathering, three to four classrooms, and a foyer.
- » Before beginning a search, determine the amount of money that is available to spend on a rental facility for church events. Keep in mind that rental rates vary depending on the size of the facility, its amenities, and its location.

3. KNOW YOUR LEGAL AND ACCESSIBILITY REQUIREMENTS:

Consider safety laws and accessibility.

» Consult with a local professional contractor or architect who is familiar with the codes and standards of your area. Codes may vary based on the city or country.



» To reflect our inclusive God, make sure your facility is accessible for everyone. For example, you may want to look for a building that has ramps, elevators, accessible bathrooms, chairs with arms, and a platform (stage) that can be reached by everyone. You may also want to consider the accessibility of the parking lot, the signage, the lighting, and the sound system.





4. KNOW YOUR OPTIONS AND OPPORTUNITIES:

Tour potential locations within your focus neighborhood and compare costs and features.

- » Visit the facilities in your area that are within your budget, meet your requirements, and meet the code and accessibility requirements you have outlined.
- » List your pros and cons for each of the facilities you visit. Is there one that best aligns with your needs?



5. KNOW YOUR FINAL ANSWER:

Make a decision based on your research.

- » Finalize the lease of the space.
- » Review the terms and conditions of the lease before signing.

- » Work with your Avenue champions to develop a strategy to engage with your neighbors and share the love of Christ in your new location.
