Tell us about your role in your local congregation.

In the Bogotá congregation, I reach out to the members of the community and am interested in understanding their needs so that our church can mobilize to help them. I focus on building and maintaining strong, healthy relationships within the church. At an organizational level, I assist those who lead the Faith, Hope, and Love Avenues, and Ministries. I believe that there cannot be a church without prayer; therefore, I emphasize weekly prayer groups.

What skills do you bring to the role?

I am a good listener; I am interested in knowing our members in depth — their dreams, their needs, their joys, and, of course, their struggles. I also enjoy teaching the word of God. I am passionate about sharing the good news, discussing, and meditating on the scriptures. Finally, I have learned to coordinate church events and gatherings and to orient people to discover how they can participate using their own strengths.

What excites you about this role?

What excites me about this role is the opportunity to see people develop a personal relationship with Christ. It is profoundly rewarding to witness individuals transforming as they connect more deeply with their faith.


What are the challenges?
